



FACULTY OF ENGINEERING AND ARCHITECTURE (FIA)

HISTORY

Known for its history and commitment to academic excellence, the Faculty of Engineering and Architecture was founded under the new Bylaws of the Saint Joseph University of Beirut, enacted on June 10, 1975. This change marked the transition from the School of Engineering of Beirut (ESIB) to the Faculty of Engineering, representing a decisive step in the University's academic development.

The Faculty of Engineering comprises four major institutions:

- The School of Engineering of Beirut (ESIB), founded in 1913, a pillar of engineering excellence in Lebanon
- The School of Mediterranean Agricultural Engineering (ESIAM), established in 1979, a key player in the agronomy field and the development of agriculture in Lebanon
- The National Institute of Telecommunications and Informatics (INCI), founded in 1985, a leading reference in information technology
- The School of Architecture of Beirut (ESAR), established in 2023, adding a new dimension to the Faculty by integrating architecture into its expertise.

The Faculty officially became the Faculty of Engineering and Architecture (FIA) in 2023, following the successful integration of ESAR, affirming its commitment to training renowned engineers and architects equipped to meet contemporary challenges.
