

The Collaborative Organizations Forum ended with a Roundtable to discuss the findings.

# CERTIFICATE IN SUSTAINABLE BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND IMPACT

The Certificate in Sustainable Business Development and Impact returns with a renewed edition, building on last year's successful program. Delivered in English and offered in a hybrid format, the certificate runs from April 14 to June 4, with sessions held every Tuesday and Thursday from 5:00 PM to 8:00 PM, for a total of 38 hours.

Led by a team of renowned experts and practitioners, the program features contributions from Dr. Hasan Youness (CSR, Social Entrepreneurship and SDGs), Dr. Ursula El Hage (Social Innovation and Entrepreneurship), Ms. Carla Saba (Green and Social Business Model), Ms. Carmen Nohra (Leadership and Advocacy for Sustainability), Dr. Wadih Skaff (Best Practices in Environmental Sustainability), Mr. Constantin Salemeh (Sustainable Investment), and Ms. Sophie Mansour (Building Sustainable Businesses: SDG17, ESG Integration & MEAL Tools) who will guide participants through key modules in sustainable business models, social entrepreneurship, governance, impact, and responsible leadership.

Participation is limited to 25 participants, ensuring an interactive and practice-oriented learning experience.

# LE “PARLEMENT DE LA JEUNESSE”

As part of the “Questions d’Égalité au Liban” project, students from Lycée Makassed Khadija El Kobra, Collège Mesrobian des Arméniens Catholiques, and École Secondaire des Filles de la Charité explored key themes related to gender equality, including women in the media, women in politics, and women in sports.

On November 7, 2025, a Youth Parliament event was organized to showcase the students’ work. The event featured a gallery walk, where each school presented its final productions through posters, followed by presentations outlining the methodology adopted and the results achieved. A lively Q&A session concluded the event, offering students a valuable platform to share their perspectives, engage in discussion, and confidently defend their ideas.



# PROJET DE RECHERCHE (IRD)

As part of the “Questions d’Égalité au Liban” project, a research study was conducted to assess the impact of a structured gender-equality awareness program on students’ perceptions in three francophone private schools in Beirut. Implemented by the CEEDD-USJ in partnership with IRD and Equipop, the study examined how sociocultural factors influence students’ understanding of gender roles and equality.

The research involved 74 secondary-level students and combined interactive workshops, student-led projects, and a Youth Parliament initiative. Using pre- and post-tests, focus groups, and qualitative analysis, the study revealed a significant shift in students’ perceptions, including a clearer distinction between sex and gender and a noticeable reduction in gender stereotypes related to professions, toys, and social roles.

Overall, the findings highlight the positive impact of participatory and interactive educational approaches in fostering critical thinking, dialogue, and more equitable representations of gender among youth.

Professor Fadi El Hage participated in the Arab Second Forum of Networks of Schools, Clubs, and Academic Chairs affiliated with ALECSO, held on 18–19 December 2025 at the UNESCO Beirut Office.

During the session on “Partnerships and Financing Green Education Projects,” he presented the experience of the Chair of “Fondation Diane” for Education on Eco-Citizenship and Sustainable Development, highlighting its approach to greening education, supporting sustainable development initiatives, and building partnerships with public institutions and the private sector.



# USJ VERTE COMMITTEE MEETING

To promote a greener university, the USJ Verte initiative was launched and continues to operate through various pillars. One key aspect is education, focusing on raising awareness about the importance of waste sorting, fostering a recycling culture, and encouraging an ecofriendly approach. The USJ Verte committee is composed of 15 members, and meets twice a year.



# STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING

Each year, the steering committee of the Chair meets twice. plays a central role in guiding the strategic direction, vision, and activities of the Chair. Composed of representatives from partner institutions, academic experts, and sustainability practitioners, the committee convenes twice a year to evaluate progress, set priorities, and ensure the relevance and impact of the Chair's initiatives.

The Journée Écologique, organized in collaboration with the Conseil des Membres du PSG de l'USJ, offered a dynamic and interactive moment of environmental awareness across several USJ campuses. 
# “JOURNÉE ÉCOLOGIQUE”


# PHD SCHOLARSHIP:

- Motivation Letter


**Evaluation & Selection**
