

Magis-L Grant Conditions 26-27

The Saint Joseph University of Beirut (USJ), dedicated to providing pathways of excellence since 1875, offers the Magis-L Grant as part of its academic policy to support students across various fields. This **non-social** scholarship, named after the Latin word Magis (meaning “more” or “greater”), is exclusively available to **first-year USJ students applying to selected undergraduate programs (Bachelor) at the Beirut campuses and all undergraduate programs at regional campuses**. The Magis-L Grant offers a tuition reduction for undergraduate studies, awarded to **the most qualified candidates** based on a thorough review of their academic records. Magis-L applications are evaluated in the order of priority based on the three admission periods (early, regular, late) and must adhere to the financial aid application deadlines:

Candidates may apply for the Magis-L Grant without submitting an admission file initially, as long as they apply to USJ within the announced deadlines if the grant is awarded.

The conditions for the Magis-L Grant are as follows:

- Submit the completed application form along with all required documents as **a single PDF file**, to bureaudirecteur@usj.edu.lb . Applications sent as multiple files will not be considered.
- Provide a certified copy of your official school transcript, including grades for 10th, 11th, and 12th grades (if applicable).
- Attach a copy of your ID or a recent civil status extract.
- Successfully complete the Lebanese Baccalaureate or its equivalent.
- Achieve placement in category A or B at the French or English Placement Test, as required by the chosen institution.
- Secure admission to your selected program at USJ.
- Successfully complete all courses in the **six semesters** of the undergraduate program to retain the grant for 3 years.
- If students switch programs, they will lose the grant unless the new program also offers the Magis-L Grant for the current academic year.
- The Magis-L Grant **cannot be combined** with the Merit Scholarship.
- During the early admission period, all USJ programs are included.

During the regular or late admission period, the Magis-L Grant is available for the following programs:
