# SAINT JOSEPH UNIVERSITY OF BEIRUT

## USJ IN NUMBERS

### Teaching • Research • Community Service

The mission of Saint Joseph University of Beirut (USJ), its vision and values are defined in its Charter. They revolve around two main pillars, teaching and research, in addition to a third pillar of community service. In that sense, USJ is a teaching and research institution. It promotes excellence and aims to shape its students into the best of the country and the region, thereby opening wide the doors of opportunity for them. Not only that, but USJ also seeks to promote dialogue through biculturalism and pluri-lingualism, all while remaining a healthy setting for reflection and character building.

**The University aims to maintain the excellence of the shaping and to ensure the pertinence of the research. It seeks to rely on the know-how as well as on the formative humanism while adapting it to the specificities of Lebanon and the Middle East.**

The Charter requires that all members of the University community be committed to advocating personal freedom while still being open to spiritual engagement.

Members of all religious denominations – whose very plurality is idiosyncratic to Lebanese society – are called upon to take part in this advocacy, which implies an underlying theme of mutual knowledge and respect. The Charter also states that USJ serves all members of the community regardless of social and ethnic distinctions, which explains the importance it accords to maintaining diversity in its faculty and student body. USJ refuses to follow one ideology, choosing instead to make its campuses an open space for dialogue and exchanging information as long as no freedoms are infringed on and no academic activities are disrupted.

USJ also accords great importance to its “third mission,” community service. The *Opération 7<sup>e</sup> jour* (O7) volunteer program, which promotes civic engagement, enables students to become more involved with the community, each according to their own area of expertise. It also teaches them social, national and human values. In addition, the diverse student bodies across the university organize cultural activities that allow everyone to showcase their skills and talents, making student life more vibrant.

Since 1923, the Hôtel-Dieu de France has been Beirut's French-speaking University Hospital; managed by Saint Joseph University, it is a non-profit hospital with a multi-faceted mission. As a training hospital, it assists in the training of interns and residents from the Faculty of Medicine in the major specialties, as well as trainees from other University institutions. As a hospital, it treats patients with dignity and respect, offering comprehensive quality care, and professional and personalized treatment through multidisciplinary teams and cutting-edge technology. As a center of excellence, it promotes advances in medicine and health care through research and medical studies, and it is involved in national and regional public health services.

Hôtel-Dieu de France's values are based on preventive medicine. These values steer its 32 medical departments and 9 specialized centers in their medical and social activities.

The Hôtel-Dieu de France Hospital continues to be a national and regional reference center, organized in networks, with the highest level of care quality.

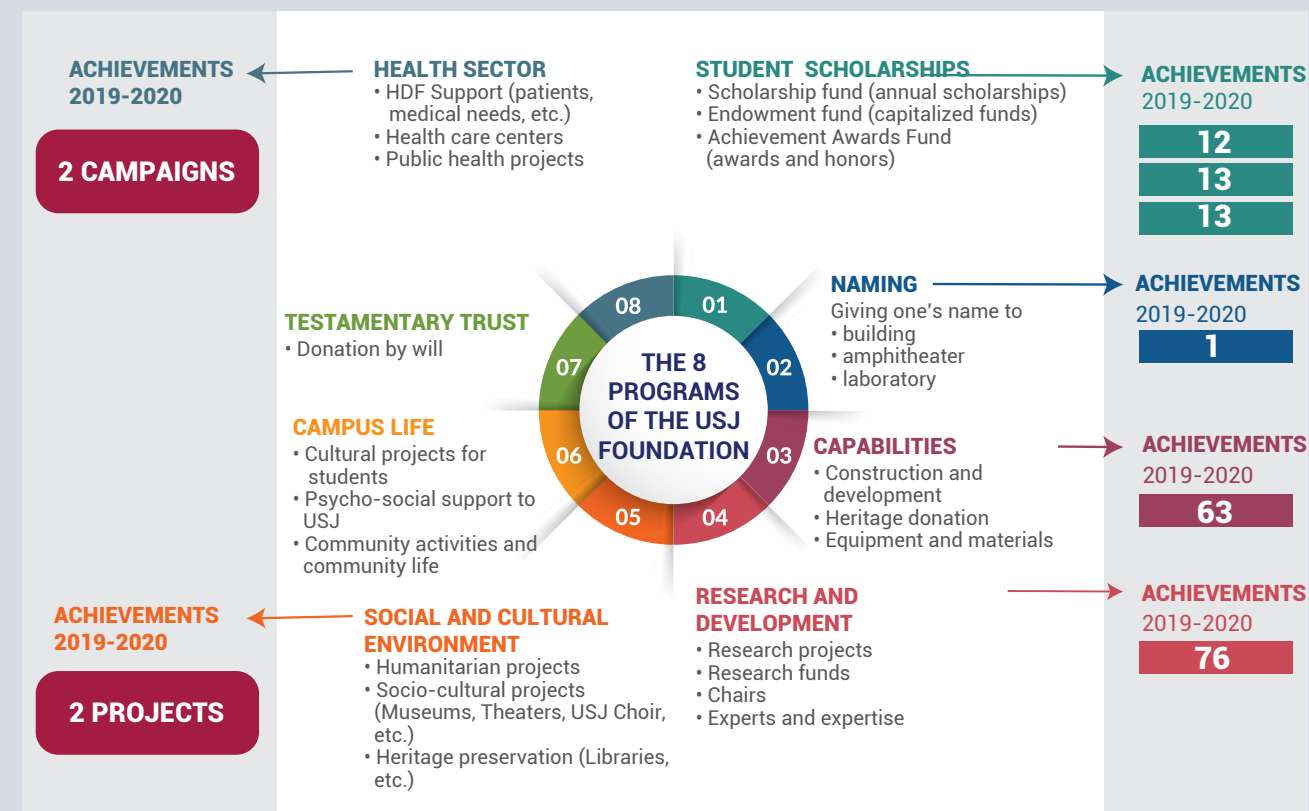

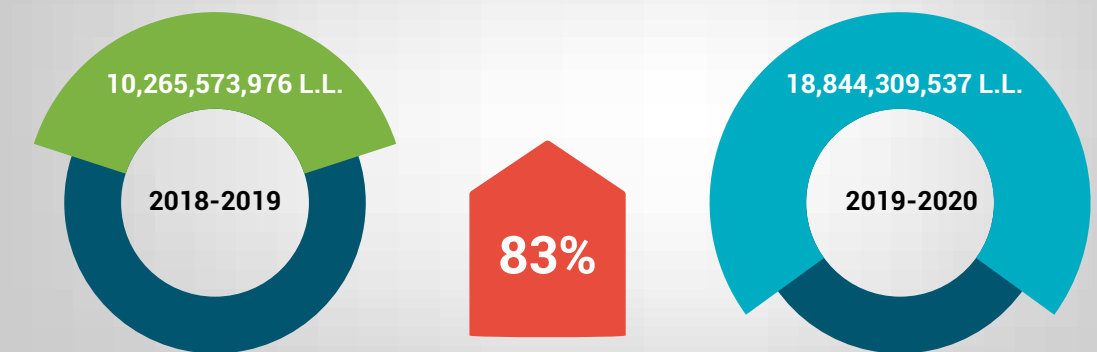


Total amount of donations collected in 2019 – 2019

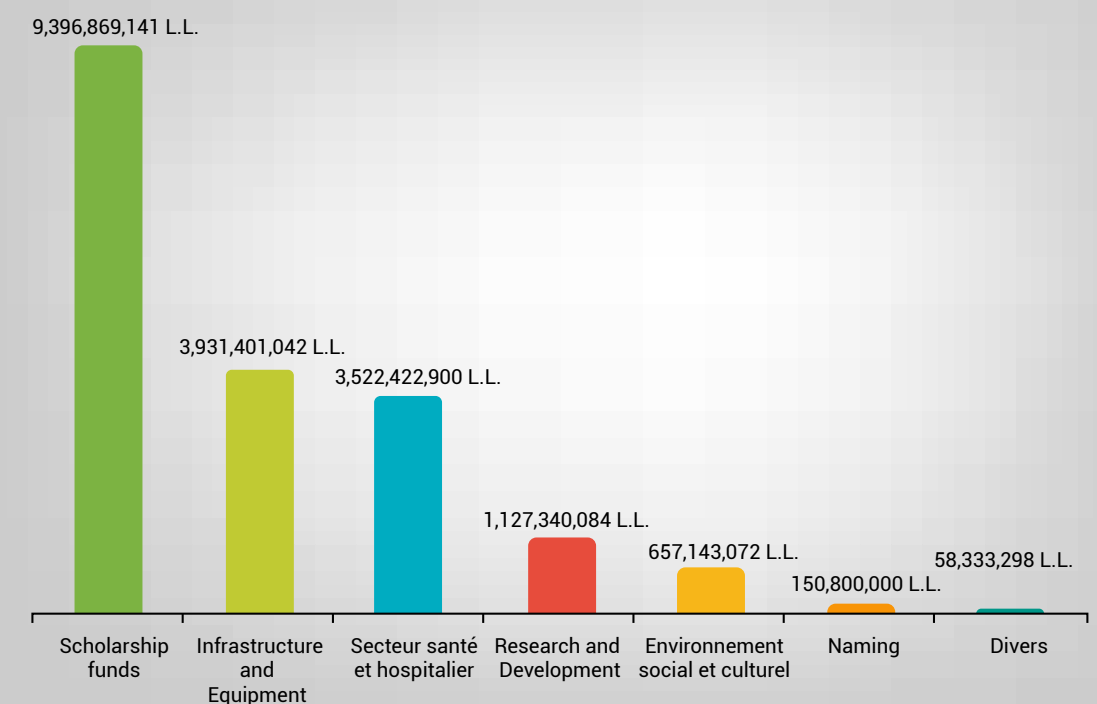

# Fundraising Overview and Report 2019 – 2020

## Launch of the Emergency Fund

A massive explosion at the Port of Beirut on Tuesday, August 4, 2020, devastated much of the capital city, killing more than 200 people, injuring over 6,000, and displacing nearly 300,000.

USJ and the Hôtel-Dieu de France Hospital (HDF), located less than a kilometer from the epicenter, were severely damaged. Our entire community, including students, faculty, and staff, has been impacted in some way.

Rebuilding the broken infrastructure and mending the broken souls will take years and years.

We acted as quickly as possible to limit the extensive damage and suffering. We relied on local and international donors, as well as alumni and friends, to rebuild and restore hope to our extended family.

In this light, USJ and its hospital, Hôtel- Dieu de France (HDF), have established an emergency and solidarity fund, which includes four fundraising campaigns:

1. "Donate to Educate": in support of USJ students.
2. "Donate to Rebuild": dedicated to the restoration of devastated campuses.
3. "USJ en mission": humanitarian project to support disadvantaged families.
4. "Donate to Heal": in support of HDF.

## Fundraising Campaigns

### Donate to Educate

In collaboration with the *Fondation USJ* and the Federation of USJ Alumni Associations, USJ launched the 2020 Campaign "*les uns pour les autres*": Donate to Educate. The goal of this fundraising campaign is to raise 2020 scholarships.

### Emergency Fund for Students Affected by the Beirut Double-Blast Launched by the Fondation USJ and the Federation of USJ Alumni Associations

After the Beirut Port explosion, the urgency has increased exponentially: more than 1,528 students have been affected by the recent events and 125 will require additional financial aid, while the resources of the University are dwindling due to the inflation. The danger of a lost generation is looming. USJ seeks to anchor Lebanese youth in their country while also helping them in obtaining quality education to preserve Lebanon's pluralism and human capital. With your help, they will be the agents of change necessary for Lebanon's recovery and the preservation of democracy in the Middle East.

## Donate to Rebuild

The estimated cost for the restoration of our 5 Campuses, as well as our other university and heritage buildings (the Oriental Library, the Monnot Theater, the Museum of Prehistory, the University for All, etc.) all located within a few meters of the explosion stands at more than **\$2,000,000 USD**.



## USJ en Mission

More than 300,000 families have been affected by the explosion. This humanitarian project aimed to provide for the needs of 750 families by sending them food boxes and hot meals every month until the end of December 2020. We continue to support the reconstruction works of about 77 houses of USJ students, staff and teachers, located in the affected zone of Beirut.

**Project Estimate: \$800,000 USD.**



## Donate to Heal

Hôtel-Dieu de France, the USJ Hospital, which took in more than 800 wounded on the evening of the explosion, has launched its "Disaster Recovery Plan" and its teams have, as always, been on the front line since the outset, in spite of the material damage suffered at the hospital.

**Initial estimates for reconstruction work amount to \$2,000,000 USD.**

**Estimates of HDF requirements for 2021:**

- Biomedical equipment: \$3,000,000 USD.
- HDF Social Fund (Patient Support): \$2,000,000 USD.





## Hôtel-Dieu de France Hospital (HDF)

In 1923, the University created its university hospital, Hôtel-Dieu de France (HDF), one of the first non-profit French-speaking hospitals in the region.

Today, HDF has 377 beds, 264 doctors, 432 nurses and 400 medical interns. Per year, the hospital approximately:

- Manages 19,000 admissions,
- Performs approximately 11,000 surgeries, and
- Supervises 30,000 consultations in emergency rooms.

HDF is a hospital center of reference at the national and regional level and is valued for its highest quality of care.

### United in the Fight

After the Rafic Hariri Governmental Hospital, the Hôtel-Dieu de France was the first hospital to commit all of its resources to the fight against COVID-19 (coronavirus). This is the university hospital's mission, its daily fight until the epidemic is over and Lebanon returns to normal life. We are committing all of our human, material, and financial resources to saving lives and easing the suffering of those affected by the virus. A large number of beds and resuscitation rooms have been set aside. To carry out its mission, HDF established a Coronavirus Solidarity Fund, which includes a social fund to assist the suffering and needy, as well as a Coronavirus medical emergency fund to provide caregivers with care and protection materials.

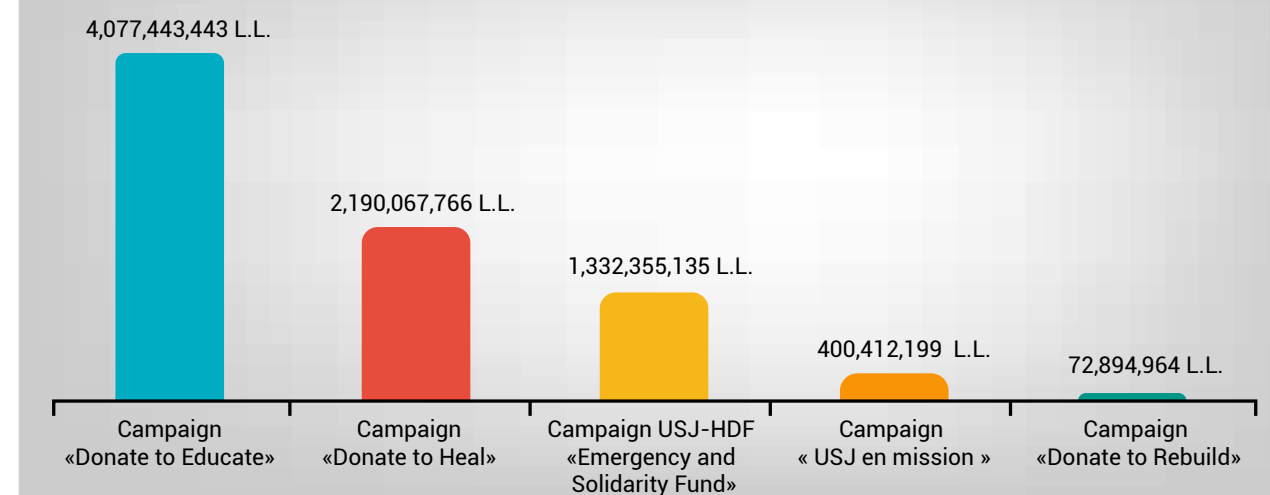
**Total amount of donations distributed by fundraising campaign**

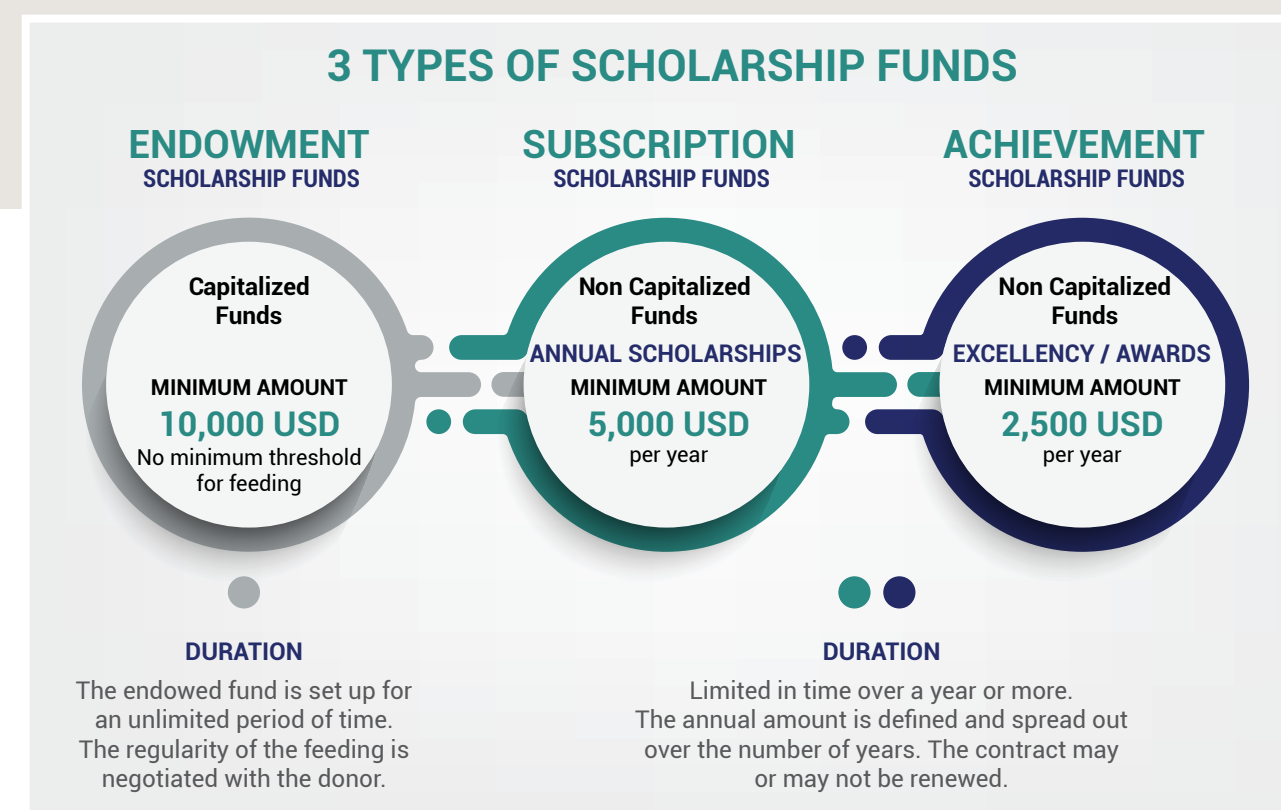


## How to participate

- 1. Capitalized Endowment Funds:** These funds are permanent, with only the interest earned used to provide student scholarships.
- 2. Subscription Scholarship Funds:** These funds are made available to the Financial Aid Office for annual student scholarships.
- 3. Achievement Funds:** These awards are entirely made up of contributions and are intended to support students' participation in academic competitions or to recognize excellence in academic achievements.

### 2. Supporting an existing scholarship Fund

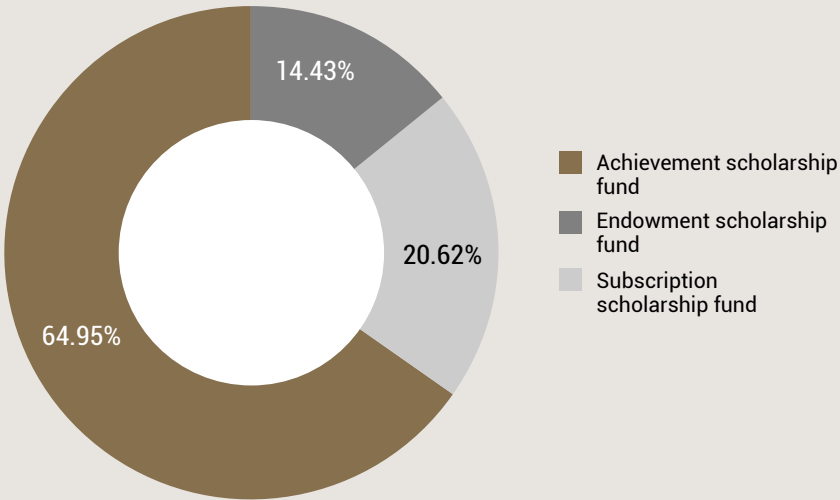

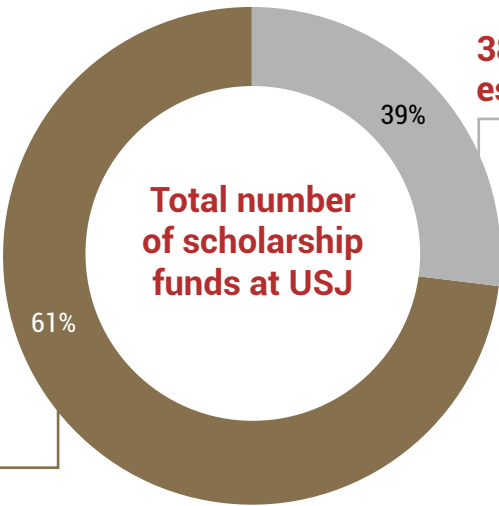

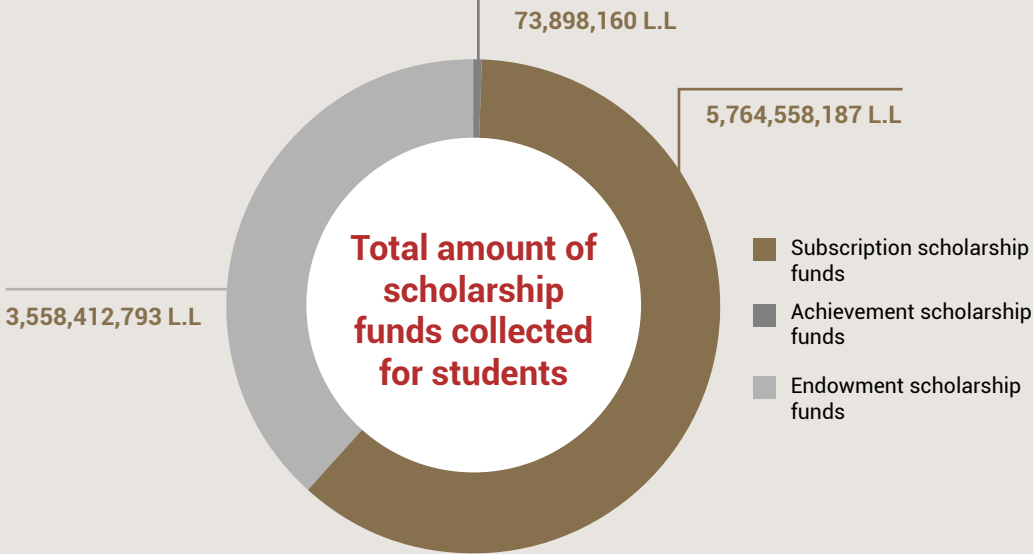

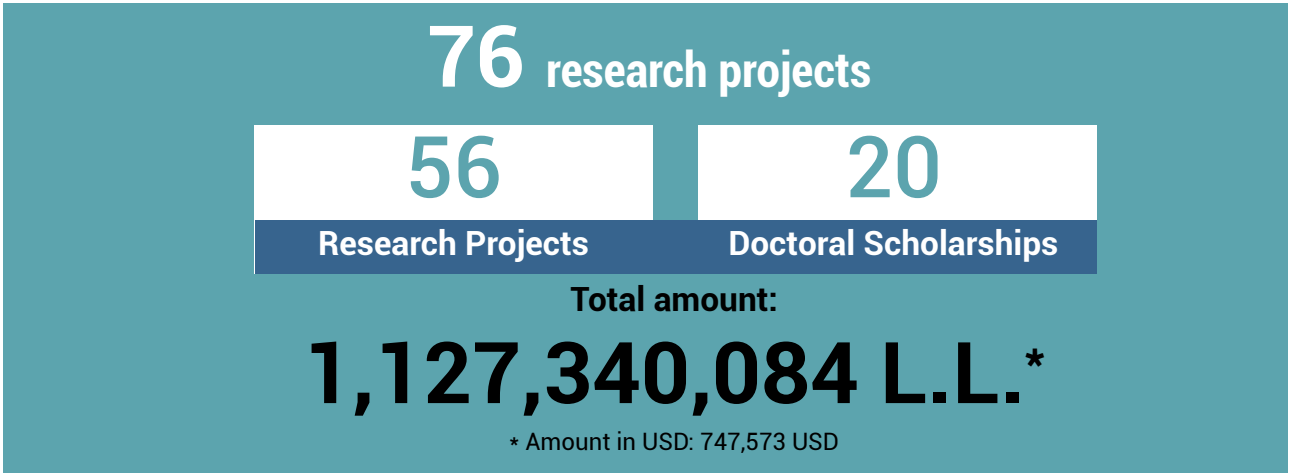
Our goals were clearer than ever:

- To help researchers and encourage them to respond to international project calls.

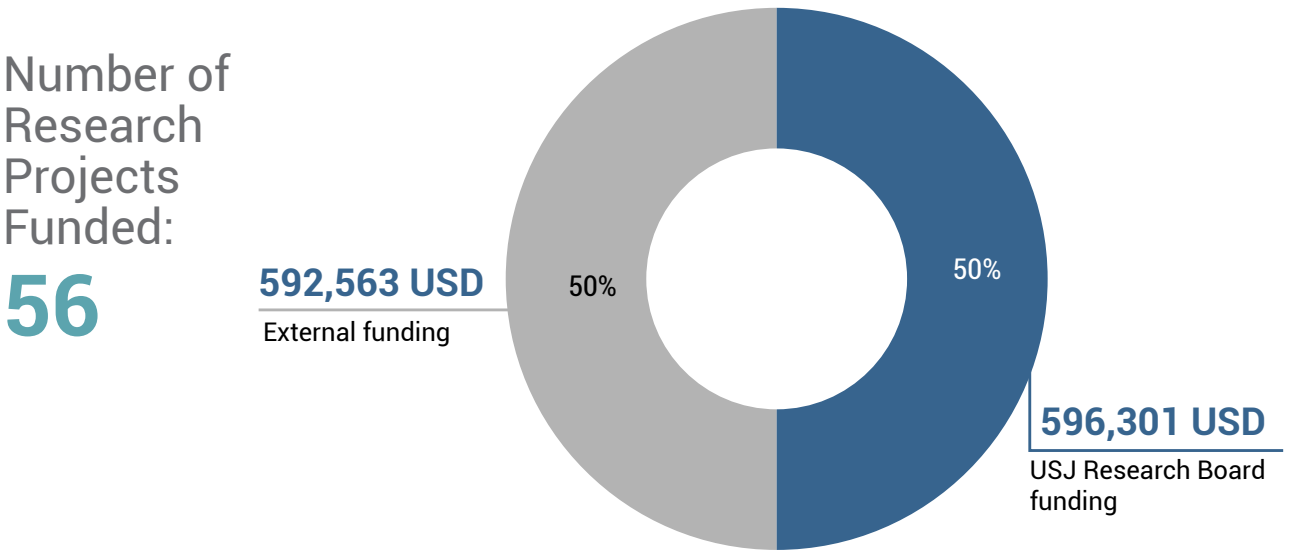
We have made every effort to secure as much external funding for research as possible, whether in the form of project funding or doctoral student scholarships.

## Research Project Funding 2019-2020

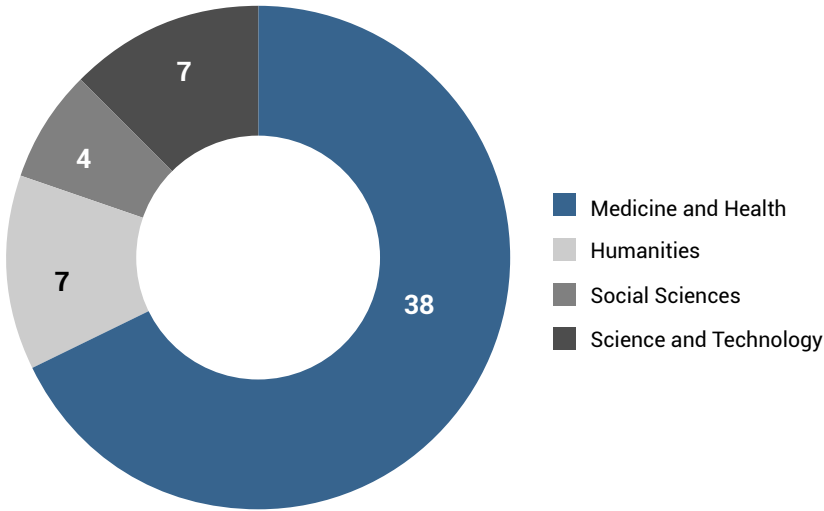

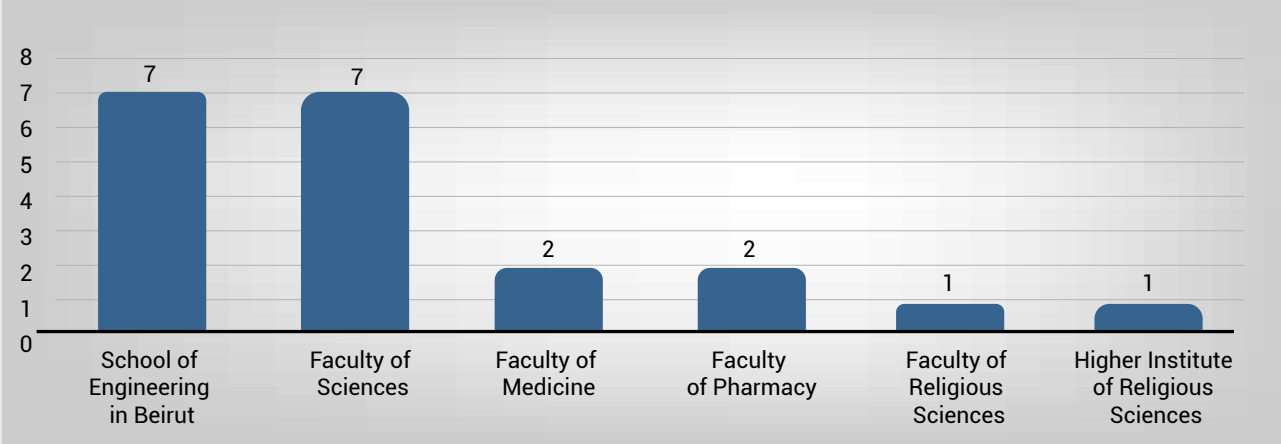

Number of research projects by field 2019-2020



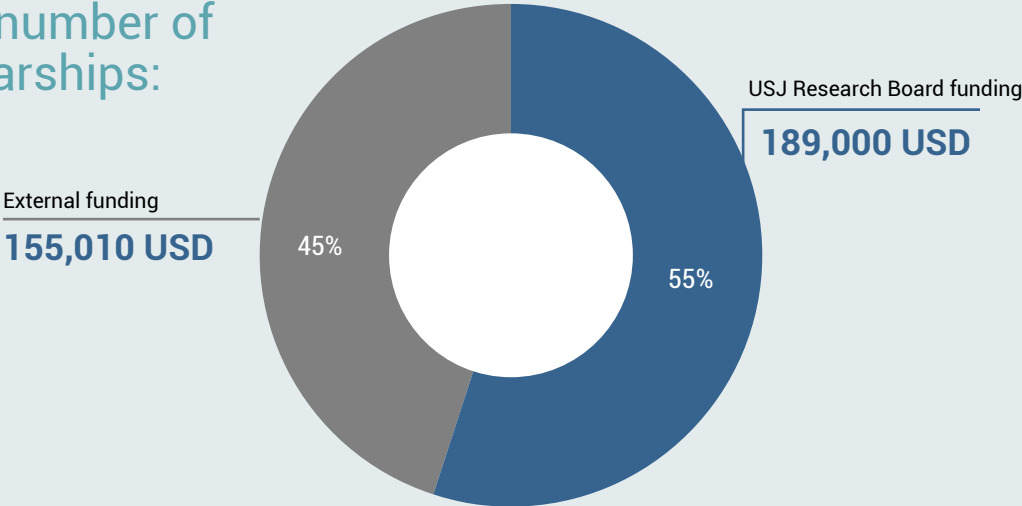
Number of doctoral scholarships by Faculty 2020-2019



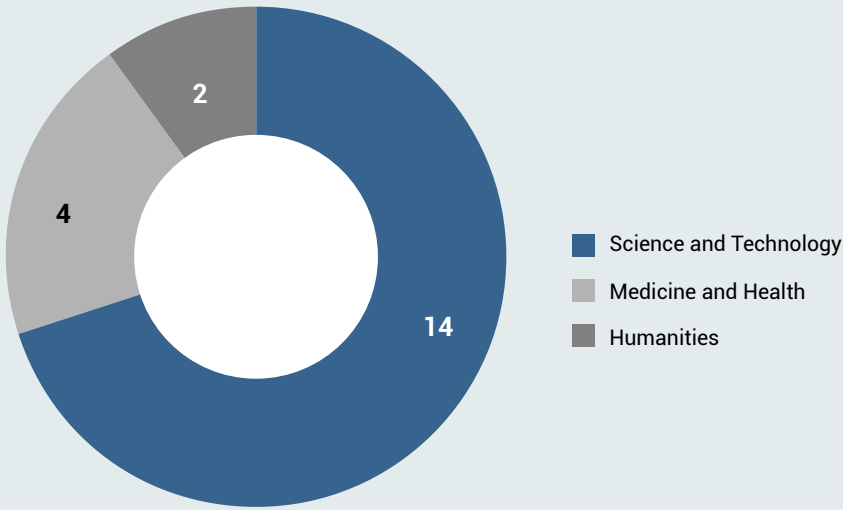

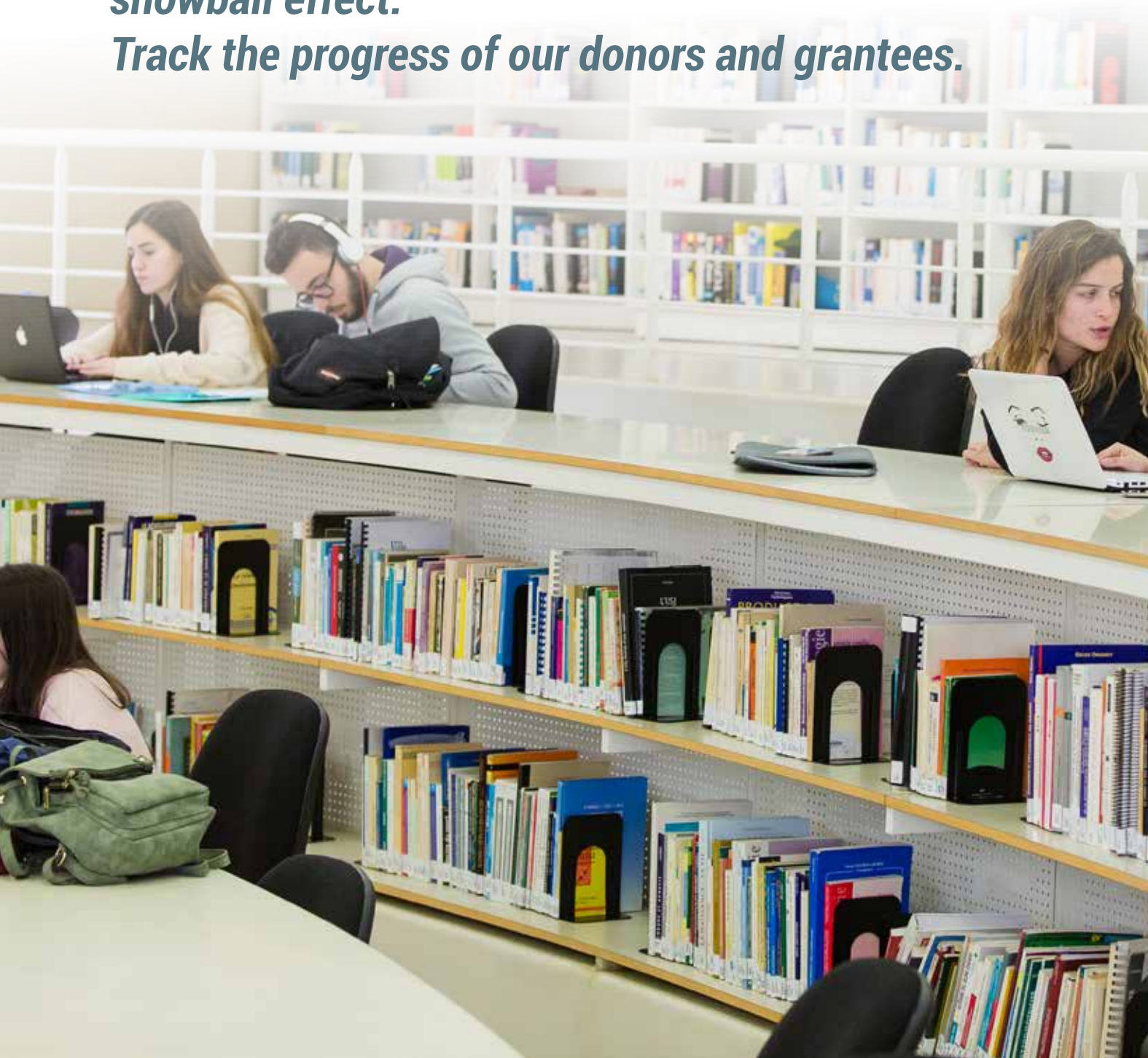
