

USJ Vaccination Campaign

Dear Partners of the USJ Community,

Procurement of the Pfizer Vaccine

We are pleased to announce that USJ/HDF is one of the four signatories¹ to the university consortium agreement with the Ministry of Public Health (MoPH) that resulted after months of negotiations to obtain 320,000 doses of the Pfizer COVID-19 Vaccine to be given to USJ students, faculty, and staff.

The agreement means that in-person academic life on campus, insofar as possible, is to resume at the beginning of the fall semester 2021, while continuing to comply with the preventive health measures that will remain essential until the end of the pandemic².

In addition, the agreement undertakes vaccinating underserved communities in cities far from the Capital, in line with the announcement made by the Minister of Public Health in February 2021.

It is noteworthy to mention that, since February 2021, the Vaccination Center of the Family Medicine Center at HDF has administered the two Pfizer doses to more than 45,000 patients under outstandingly favorable conditions from the standpoint of reception, care, and medical follow-up, according to written and oral testimonies from the vaccinated public.

Vaccination Campaign at USJ

The vaccination of the USJ Community should start this upcoming June.

An *ad-hoc* committee, including representatives, teachers, and students from the University's health science schools and institutes and from Hôtel-Dieu de France, has been formed and is being coordinated by the Secretary General of USJ³, to draw up the roll-out strategy for this campaign and to provide the necessary means and logistical tools for its proper implementation.

People wishing to be vaccinated in the framework of this campaign **will have to register beforehand on the platform of the Ministry of Health.**

We can only encourage all members of our Community as well as every Lebanese citizen and resident of this country to get vaccinated, for their own good and the good of the community at risk of infection.
