HEALTH CARE AND INSURANCE (Mandatory)	EU STUDENTS - must have at least European Health insurance card	NON-EU STUDENTS - they must present a medical insurance policy.

Students from non-European Union countries: It is mandatory for international students who are not covered by the Spanish Social Security National Health Care System to bring an insurance policy from their home country which covers illness, hospitalization, accidents, civil liability, and repatriation for the entire length of time to be spent at the University.
