Why Grad School?





Questions

- □ Is graduate school right for me? What are my career goals?
 - Personal interests, goals, dreams, and abilities.
 - Skills, competencies, and weaknesses
 - Investment of time 2 to7 years of student/researcher life
 - Intense hardwork
 - Investment of money
 - Career goals: Academia, Research, Industry R&D





More Questions

■ What will I specialize in? What are my interests?

- Do I want to go on the job market already? Or could I go for another two to seven years of school?
- Do I have the academic and personal qualities to succeed?





Graduate School Application





Graduate School Application

- ☐ Highly selective 22,000 apply; 3,400 get accepted
- Deadlines in November/December
- Pick a Department: Mechanical, Civil, Computer&Electrical
- □ Pick a degree
 - Masters 2 years, courses + written thesis
 - Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) 4-6 years, courses + written thesis + defense



Graduate School Application Process

- TOEFL or IELTS (AMISEAST)
- □ GRE (AMISEAST)
- Academic Transcripts
- 3 Letters of recommendation
- 1 motivation letter (Statement of Purpose)
- Work and research experience



Requirements

- Solid science, math, and engineering course list
- ☐ High GPA
- GRE-Graduate Records Exam of 3 sections (math, vocabulary, writing)
 - Math requirement (goal score: 168-170/170)
- TOEFL (reading, listening, speaking, writing)



Statement of Purpose

- Why do I want to get a PhD?
- Why did I choose this specific field?
- Why do I want to go to this university?
 - □Specific program, specific faculty or lab, etc.
- Which professors do I want to work with?
 - □ Look up specific professors and include their names in the essay
- What are my career goals?





Letters of Recommendation

- ☐ Usually need 3
 - Preferably should all be PhDs (maybe 1 max from industry)
 - Preferably research advisors
 - Other options: Deans/profs who you've worked with on extracurriculars, professors who have taught you a course that you did very well in (particularly if it's the area of focus for PhD)
- ☐ Faculty well-known in their field are a plus





Experience

- □ Teaching Assistant or Mentoring Experience
 - Subjects taught?
 - Class size?
- Research experience/projects
- Internships
 - Emphasize any R&D work
 - Overall technical skills gained
- Other activities may include leadership, international development, volunteering...





Financial aspects





Financial Aspects

(yearly)

- □ Tuition fees ~ \$ 50,000
- ☐ Housing ~ \$ 12,000
- ☐ Life expenses ~ \$ 12,000

~ \$ 75,000





Financial Aspects

NEVER an ISSUE

All expenses covered by either:

- Fellowship/Scholarship (less pressure from your advisor, but still work as an RA)
- Research Assistantship (RA)
- □ Teaching Assistantship (TA) (more time consuming)

Non cumulable





Assistantships

- Research Assistantship
 - Paid to work on the thesis/dissertation you are completing
 - This is why research is so important
- Teaching Assistantship
 - Assist faculty in teaching courses and labs
 - At least one semester of teaching is typically required





Fellowships

- Typically require essays and recommendation letters
 - But you're already getting these when applying to graduate school
- Special fellowships available based on country or region
 - Check with AMISEAST
 - Search online and talk to friends who have applied





Fulbright Foreign Student Program

- Conduct research and study in the United States
- Sent over 1,000 students to the U.S. since 1970s
- Many different options available
 - Can do one-year project or multi-year degree program
