and grades received. Students must ensure that their home institution awards credit for Regent's courses.

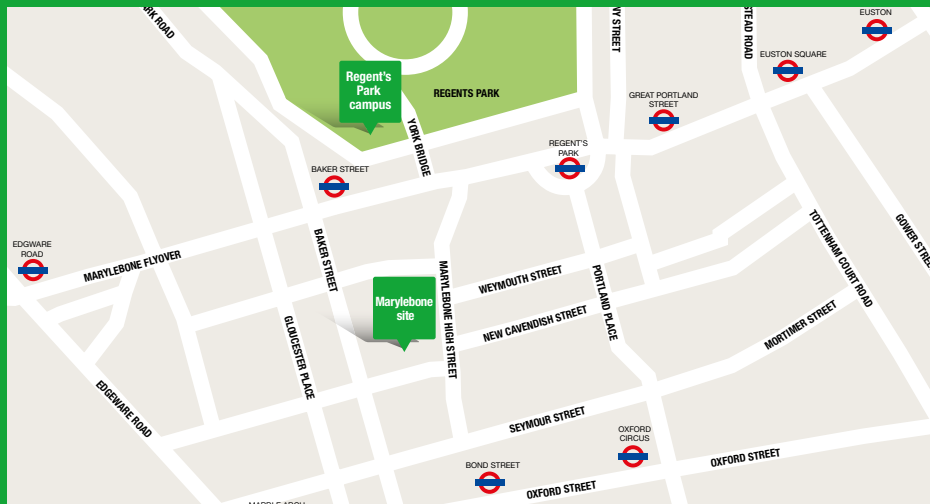
### Social and cultural activities\*
