## Speech of Professor Salim Daccache s.j. at the Mexican dinner in l'Atelier, on April 23, 2018

Your Excellency Mr. Jose Ignacio Madraso and Dear Friends,

It is with great happiness that we are celebrating the Mexican cuisine week at Saint Joseph University of Beirut. Gastronomy is a good way to build up good relations between people. I want to express my gratitude to Mr Christian Taoutel, professor at the USJ and lover of Mexico, and to the SUN Holiday agency for sponsoring the trip of the culinary chef Eva Raygossa who came especially from Mexico to animate this event. We are particularly pleased that this Mexican week is being held here at the USJ, at the restaurant of our young students l'Atelier. My thanks go to the team of the restaurant, to Mr Joseph Tannous, to chef Hanna, and to Miss Cynthia Ghobril Andrea for setting up this week with the Atelier team.

With Mexico, it is a long and great story that can be summed up in one beautiful quote from President Adolfo Lopez Mateos: "El que no tenga a amigo libanes, que lo busque "which means "He who does not have a Lebanese friend, should find one!"
